At Uplift, our numbers speak for themselves. Our schools consistently outperform other available public educational alternatives in student achievement. And our students have the drive to succeed and grow into informed, compassionate leaders.

We graduate our first class this year at Peak Preparatory, our first urban campus. These 26 seniors had 100% TAKS pass rates in all subject areas tested as 11th graders.

Who We Are—100% Success

Uplift Education, a non-profit 501c3 organization, operates five high-performing charter school campuses in the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex. Each school provides free college preparatory education, including Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate curriculum, to a largely low-income student population. Our goal is to close the achievement gap between students in low-income communities and those in more suburban neighborhoods, to make the college dream a reality for everyone and to instill a life-long love of learning and citizenship.

Charter schools are independently managed public schools funded by the state. They differ from traditional schools in many ways. As a charter school, we are able to empower our school leaders and hold them accountable for results, giving them authority to build their school's culture, hire and fire staff, as well as manage operating budgets. Our educators spend more time on task, meaning they are more accessible due to extended days and school years, and are available until 9:00 p.m. to answer questions. Additionally, we are governed by a dual-board structure that allows increased focus on student achievement. Our board members are committed volunteers passionate about education reform versus elected officials in traditional school districts.

The Need for Charter Schools

The achievement gap is real and present in Dallas. Here are a few facts to consider:

91% of White students in DISD passed the 2008-09 Science TAKS test versus 68% Hispanic and 62% African American students 75.7% of White students in DISD graduated from high school in 2007 (most recent data available) versus 59.8% Hispanic and 63.5% African American seniors Nationally, only 17% of students who enter college graduate from college


Fewer college graduates means major costs to our economy:

- Over the course of a lifetime, a college graduate will earn over \$1 million more than a high school graduate
- Male high school dropouts are 47 times more likely to be incarcerated than college graduates
- The unemployment rate is four times higher for high school dropouts than college graduates

Commit to College: Uplift Education is committed to building a brighter future—one student at a time. We do this by creating quality, college preparatory public schools in underserved communities. Commit to Community: Our community approach means that we actively reach out to local leaders and invite them to help us improve education in their communities. Commit to Change: By nurturing academic performance and civic responsibility from kindergarten through high school, we do more than expand our students' horizons. We also change people's perceptions of how education can reduce social inequality and improve the world around us.



Commitment to Excellence—The 7 Rs

Each Uplift school shares a common set of values that we internally refer to as the 7 Rs. Each one represents the commitments we make to our students, parents and our community.

What do we bring to our work?

We *rigorously* prepare each student to enter, and subsequently, to succeed in college. It is the overriding objective in everything we do.

We expect everyone within our community to maintain high ethical standards, both in their professional *responsibilities* and personal lives.

How do we engage in our work?

We are uncompromising in our dedication to making "every second count" when impacting the life of a child. Our focus on *real time* is an important part of our success.

We foster *relationships* through our grade-level teams, as well as with the smaller school enrollment. We seek and retain the best teachers and leaders.

We continually *reflect* and improve by examining our results and sharing successful approaches across our schools, while seeking out best practices from other institutions.

We will use curriculum that is *relevant* to the lives of our students, teaching them to be world citizens and to mutually work for the greater good.


We will measure and report our *results* on an ongoing basis.



Strategic Priorities for 2009-10

Our five strategic themes for 2009-10 focus on student achievement, the key component of our mission.

- **1. Build and retain great people:** We are constantly evaluating each stage of our talent lifecycle, from recruitment to reward and retention, to ensure we have the best talent in our schools and charter management organization (CMO).
- 2. Excel in math and science: Our average math pass rates on TAKS are 15 points higher than neighboring DISD schools and 17 points higher in science. However, we recognize that in order to prepare our students to be successful in the future, we need to make sure we have the best math and science academic programs.
- **3. Connect and equip our people:** We are working with Hitachi Consulting and The Michael & Susan Dell Foundation to create an intranet portal that brings student data seamlessly into the classroom and allows our teachers to collaborate across our 15 schools.
- **4. Make the college dream a reality:** Uplift's goal is for 100% of our graduating students to go on to college. However, we realize for many of our students, financing their college dreams will be challenging. Hence, our Road to College team has set a goal of \$12 million in awarded scholarships for our high school students.
- **5. Prepare to serve 10,000 by 2020:** We are building out our formal systems, processes, and organizational resources to support our new school growth efforts.











Metroplex Campuses and Counting

Uplift operates five campuses in the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex. We have locations in Northwest Dallas (Williams Prep), East Dallas (Peak Prep), Southwest Dallas (Hampton Prep), Irving (North Hills Prep), and Arlington (Summit International Prep). When scouting locations for our schools, we target communities with a high percentage of students who qualify for the free and reduced lunch program, as well as areas where more high-quality, free, public education choices are needed. Across our four urban campuses, our current free and reduced lunch student population is 83%.


