

## Heights Secondary Scholar Parking Agreement 23-24

Because of the limited number of scholar parking spaces available, permits will be issued in the following priority:

- 1. Scholars with disabilities
- 2. Seniors
- 3. Juniors
- 4. High School scholars participating in school-sponsored activities
- 5. Freshman

Please Read the Following Carefully:

- 1. Parking permits are \$20
  - a. There will be a \$10 replacement fee if a permit is lost or stolen
  - b. If your permit is revoked, a refund will not be issued for your purchased tag
- 2. All unregistered vehicles or vehicles violating regulations will be issued a notice by Uplift Heights and may be ticketed by the Dallas Police Department. Unregistered vehicles may also be towed at the vehicle owner's expense or have a boot placed on the wheel. There will be a \$50 charge to remove a boot.
- 3. Scholar parking permits are available upon registration of vehicle with the administration.
- 4. Vehicles parked on school property are under the jurisdiction of the school. The school reserves the right to search any vehicle if reasonable cause exists to do so with or without the presence of the scholar driver present.
- 5. A scholar has full responsibility for security of his/her vehicle and will make certain it is locked, and keys are not given to others.
- 6. A scholar will be held responsible for any prohibited objects or substances, such as alcohol, drugs, or weapons that are found in his/her car and will be subject to disciplinary action, as well as criminal prosecution.



These regulations will be strictly enforced. Violators will be issued warnings prior to being towed, booted or having permits revoked.

I may lose my privilege to park on school property by:

- 1. Driving recklessly, speeding, and/or burning rubber on school grounds.
- 2. Driving off school grounds during school hours without getting the appropriate permission and signing out properly. This includes use of the vehicle during lunch.
- 3. Parking in the staff, visitors, loading dock, volunteer, or handicap parking areas
- 4. Taking other students off school grounds without appropriate permission.
- 5. Not having the correct parking permit hanging from my rear-view mirror.
- 6. Loaning other scholars my parking permit and/or my car
- 7. Disregarding parking lot signs such as DO NOT ENTER or RIGHT TURN ONLY, etc.
- 8. Remaining in or around cars before or after school.
- 9. Returning to the car anytime during the day, unless scheduled to leave school grounds. Students may return to their cars if they have appropriate approval from administration or security
- 10. Being tardy to school 3 times permit will be taken for one to two weeks. An additional tardy will result in the loss of parking permits for the semester.
- 11. Using old, expired, or forged parking permits.
- 12. Giving false or misleading information on my parking application.
- 13. Having illegal substances, drugs, alcohol, weapons etc. in my car.
- 14. Not having a regular driver's license when applying for a permit.
- 15. Having lower than a 2.0 (unweighted) GPA. Grades are subject to review throughout the semester. Scholars must remain in good standing to park on campus.
